In the implementation of our projects:

- Aim at the recommendations of the Sustainable Development Goals advocated by the UN,
- Procure local construction material (minimizing transport and making the most of what is available locally),
- Recommend renewable energies as much as possible (photovoltaic, thermal solar, biogas, etc.),
- Use biodegradable and non-polluting materials as much as possible,
- Use organic fertilizers in the supported fields and vegetable gardens,
- Promote local production, processing and consumption,
- Include in each project an element of environmental protection in the form of reforestation, environmental and/or hygiene awareness,
- Favour bioclimatic architecture,
- Support at least four projects per year that have a major positive impact on the environment (CO₂ capture or reduction, reforestation, increase in vegetation cover, production of clean energy, etc.).

In the organization of our solidarity camps:

- Compensate all emissions produced by the solidarity camps by our projects,
- Encourage participants to travel by public transport,
- Address elements of environmental and climate protection in training courses during preparation sessions,
- Make participants aware of the negative impacts of air travel,
- When travelling by plane, limit stopovers and choose the most direct routes,
- Use recycled and recyclable, non-polluting, local and organic products.

In our work in Switzerland:

- Use chlorine-free bleached recycled paper,
- Encourage the team to travel by public transport,
- Use recycled and recyclable, non-polluting, local and organic products.
